STORY: MOSES & AARON – EXODUS 4:10–16

DISCUSS:

READ THE BIBLE STORY FROM EXODUS 4 OR FROM YOUR FAVORITE STORY BIBLE. HAVE YOUR KIDS RETELL THE STORY IN THEIR OWN WORDS & ANSWER THE FOLLOWING QUESTIONS TOGETHER.

1. Why did Moses tell God he couldn't do what He asked? What was Moses worried about?
2. Who did God send to help Moses, and how did that show God's love and care?
3. Who are some of the helpers God has placed in your life?
4. What's one way you could be a helper this week? Maybe at home, at school, or in your neighborhood?
5. What does this story teach us about God's promises? How does it make you feel knowing that God gives us helpers when things feel too big or hard?

BIG IDEA: GOD GIVES US HELPERS

DID YOU KNOW?

Moses didn't think he was the right person to talk to Pharaoh because he said he "wasn't good with words." He worried people wouldn't listen to him or that he'd mess up what God wanted him to say! But God reminded Moses that He made his mouth—and that He would give him the words to speak. To help even more, God sent Moses' brother Aaron to speak alongside him.

That's a big reminder for us, too! Sometimes we feel too small, too shy, or not "good enough" to do big things for God—but just like Moses, God can use anyone who's willing to listen and trust Him... even kids! When we let God lead, He gives us the courage and the helpers we need to do amazing things.

THIS WEEKS CHALLENGE:

This week, look for chances to point out God's helpers in your child's life. When a teacher encourages them, a friend shares, or a sibling lends a hand—pause and say, "See? God gives us helpers!" You can also talk about times when they were a helper to someone else. These simple moments help kids connect everyday experiences to God's bigger promise of support—and remind them that we can trust God to surround us with people who help and care for us.

PROMISES

PRAYER PROMPT:

Take turns naming someone who has helped you this week—maybe a teacher, friend, parent, or sibling. Then thank God for each of those helpers by name. Ask God to help your family notice the ways He sends people to support you, just like He sent Aaron to help Moses.
