ith its round ears, black button nose, and thick gray and white fur, the koala looks like a teddy bear that's come to life. But even though it's often called a koala bear, the koala isn't a bear. It's a marsupial (mar-SOO-pee-uhl), just like the kangaroo.



Koalas only live in one place in the world: Australia. They spend most of their lives—as much as 22 hours a day—sleeping in eucalyptus trees. It's a pretty convenient location because eucalyptus leaves are the *only* thing they eat. No berries, no seeds, no nuts. Just eucalyptus leaves.

The thing is, eucalyptus leaves have a very strong smell. In fact, the oils from these leaves are often used to make cough drops, so you might have smelled their sharp scent before. Because koalas eat so many eucalyptus leaves, they sometimes smell like furry little cough drops!

What goes in will come out. It's true for koalas and their cough-drop scent, and it's true for us too. I don't mean you'll smell like that pizza you ate. But if you put things like anger, jealousy, gossip, or hate in your heart, guess what's going to come out in your words and actions? That same nasty stuff.
